What a crazy weather week! I just viewed a meme that read, "Temperature went from 90 to 55 like it just saw a state trooper." Fantastic. The weather may be difficult to keep up with here in mid-Michigan but our students and teachers keep doing amazing things inside the classroom, which should help us cope with our *Pure Michigan climate*.

Over the next couple of weeks, I want to share with you some tools we are going to provide to assist our parents in raising well adjusted, solution oriented, loving, and caring disciples of Jesus. We will include a section in our Jet Gazette, starting next week, with helpful links to parenting articles and other material to help inform and guide us as parents. Also, I'm pleased to announce that Mrs. Kasey Cronin, Director of GCCS, and I will be hosting a parent night in mid-November (date still to be determined) to discuss ways to help our students with conflict resolution and bullying prevention.

However, for this week I want to utilize the rest of my space to introduce The KNOW program which will help our students learn how to keep themselves safe in all environments they encounter.

The KNOW program is the newest program to ensure children's safety designed specifically for the Diocese of Lansing. Both parents and students are encouraged to attend together. The KNOW program has 4 goals:

- Empower children and their parents to KNOW how to identify and talk about safe, respectful behaviors and situations.
- To help children KNOW how to identify and talk about behaviors and situations that are not safe.
- Help adults appropriately respond to concerns about being unsafe and/or disrespected.
- Inspire Christian communities to greater integrity and authenticity in creating unfailingly safe environments for children.

Hope in a Box


Catholic Charities in Flint is asking for extra donations of personal care items.


