Stamps will be sold each morning for 10¢ each. Letters will be delivered to classrooms each day. Letters mailed after 12 PM may be delivered the following day.


> Letters should be addressed like this:


# Volunteer Hour Opportunity



# Staff Spotlight

O Christmas Tree, O Christmas Tree... As we all start to deck the halls in our own homes, we asked our staff to describe their Christmas trees.



Mrs. Custodio: My tree is artificial. I started a new theme this year, so we now have a bow adorning the top of our tree. We always decorate it on Thanksgiving, but this year we got excited and decorated early.

Mrs. Dawes: My main Christmas tree is an artificial tree with white lights and an angel on time. Most of the ornaments are older glass ornaments my mom handed down to me. My three small tree alpine trees have white lights and snowman ornaments.

Ms. Wharff: I try to get my Christmas tree up right after Thanksgiving, but I'm running late this year! I LOVE glitter and all things sparkly, so I have lots of glittery, sparkly ornaments. I also have a lot of special student ornaments that have been gifted to me. Each year, as I put them up I remember all the students I've been blessed to teach. :) Mrs. Ratke; My tree is artificial with lights that Change from white to colored. There is an angel on top and it is full of my Children's ornaments. Mr. Ratke and I have our own small tree to decorate.

Mrs. Stickel: My husband I were married in Frankenmuth and we received a set of glass ornaments from Bronner's as a gift from our pastor to decorate our first Christmas tree. Since then, we have gone to Bronner's every year and each member of our family buys a new ornament to hang. What started out as a tradition for just my husband and I has turned into a magical day of fun and love with our three daughters seeing Santa, choosing an ornament, and stuffing ourselves with chicken. Our tree is like a scrapbook of our lives and I love opening up the boxes of ornaments each year to remember our journey as a family.

Mrs. Wright: Decorating our Christmas tree is one of the highlights of this season. Everyone pitches in to put on their favorite ornaments. We have a beautiful lighted angel that sits atop the tree and a nativity scene that sits below. I like to leave our decorations up through the feast of the Baptism of the Lord in January.

Mrs. Adams: We have an artificial tree with multi-colored lights, which I like to set to blink on and off, and angel on the top of the tree. Our tree is decorated with a mixture of ornaments, some new, some old-going back to ornaments my children made in school, quite a combination! We usually play Christmas songs when we decorate it.

Mrs. Haiss: Our Christmas tree has white lights and is topped with a star. Years ago, it was topped with an angel until my son came home from Kindergarten and said, "Mom, don't you know that everyone followed the star when Jesus was born? That's why you're supposed to have a star on top of the tree." Needless to say, we've had a star ever since. Our tree is mostly decorated in red, green, and gold.



Mr. Garbutt: We have a fake tree made of plastic (sorry turtles). It has a silver and gold color scheme with a star on the top. We have lots of fun putting on the decorations. The lights on the tree are controlled by a remote so they can be either colored or white.

Mrs. Salzano: The Salzano tree is 3 feet tall and sits on a little side table so our Cat, Milosh, doesn't destroy it!

Mrs. Farella: We set up an artificial tree every year decorated with warm white lights and many ornaments that are new, old, and handmade by my children in the younger years. The star of Bethlehem is our tree topper.

Mrs. Roche: The day we decorate the trees at our house is always my favorite day leading up to Christmas. I love how our tree smells. We use a ton of white lights...it takes forever to put each of them on, but it's so worth it. I can't wait to get our tree this year.

Mrs. Boyle: We get our tree the day after Thanksgiving from a tree farm in Brooklyn, Michigan. We always get a too tall, too full Frasier fir. We set it up and let it settle for a few days before putting on lights, ornaments, and a star at the top. We usually put a Nativity under the tree, but with Natalie almost Crawling, we will have to find a new place for it this year!

Ms. Alyatim: I have an artificial tree but growing up we had beautiful outdoor trees. We put on colored lights. Our theme is Christmas colors. The only thing that is not coordinating is our advent wreath on the kitchen table (purple, pink, gold, and white) with pearls and grapes. I put a lot of work into that wreath. I love redecorating it each year. I love putting Christmas stuffed animals around the tree but my dog likes to destroy them. We have to be extra Careful. These are toys my parents have been giving to my sons throughout their lives. Snow globes are popular in our house.

Mrs. Whitney: We have a real tree. It's a big deal for us to find the "perfect" tree. We have a star that tops the tree and, each year, one of my sons puts the start on top. We have a lot of Crazy ornaments on our tree!

Mrs. Werschky: I have a white tree with silver and shades of blue for ornaments, as well as a real that that is multi-colored with special family ornaments on it. I love to decorate the tree as a family, but I am always amused with the way they disappear when it is time to take the trees down.
