Dear GCCS Families,

As you have heard by now, St. Pius X Catholic School will not reopen next year. This decision was made after much prayer, thought and deliberation. My own children received an excellent education at St. Pius X and have lifelong friends they made here. The loss has been felt by many. We ask for your prayers for the entire St. Pius X Catholic School community of families, staff, and administration. As a GCCS community, we share in the loss of this school and seek answers.

Whenever a school in the GCCS family suffers, we all do. This closing as well as the closing of another excellent school, St. Mary Catholic School in Mt. Morris two years ago, have many wondering of the status of Catholic School in Genesee County. It is important to know that the Pastors, Principals, Diocese of Lansing Superintendent have been actively working on a plan to sustain Catholic education in Genesee County, including Flint. We currently are meeting biweekly with a consulting firm to develop a plan. We ask for your patience as we work through this process. Our goal is to have a general 5 -10 year plan in place in June 2020. We are currently discussing a myriad of options including looking at combining schools to a location near Powers Catholic High School, using existing schools and facilities, as well as building new. The committee is committed to having a Catholic School to serve the Flint area. The work also includes reviewing governance models and ways to fund our schools. The committee will continue to update you on their work.




