Happy Snow Day,

We had a beautiful week celebrating our Catholic school capped off with a Friday Snow Day! I hope that our students are able to bundle up and enjoy the winter weather this weekend so they are ready for more learning adventures next week! We have had a great Catholic Schools Week, highlighted by our Day of Service, our first almost-All School Mass since last March, celebrated by Bishop Boyea, and the all school rosary. As I reflect upon the week and look forward to what is to come, it is amazing how far God has brought us but also that we are intensely planning things that are going to happen in March.

I'll try to keep this brief this week, since everyone more than likely is busy enjoying the weekend while not really wanting to hear from me. HA! Here's the rundown for the snow day after the 97th day:

- We will push our final day of Catholic Schools Week celebration to Thursday, February 11. Next Thursday, we will still have Soup-er Bowl collection and students can still wear the team apparel of their choice if they bring in a can of soup (or any canned item for that matter). We will provide the pizza lunch to the students, going with the same plan that was supposed to happen today.
- Reminder, we have a half day of school on February 12 and no school on February 15.
- The holy season of Lent is just around the corner. The school-only Ash Wednesday Mass will be at 10AM on
 February 17 in the Church. Our 2nd-8th Grade will attend in-person while one of our clergy will come over to the
 school to distribute ashes to our Preschool, Kindergarten and First Grades. During Lent, we will have two schoolwide Stations of the Cross services along with learning about prayer, fasting and almsgiving in our homerooms.
- The parish will continue to provide for the celebration of Sunday Mass in the church, in the activity center, and in the parking lot for the foreseeable future. Mass times are 5 PM Saturday and Sunday mornings at 8:30 AM, 10 AM and 11:30 AM. Please join us.
- We will have a half day of school on March 4, allowing for afternoon and evening parent-teacher conferences. Unlike the fall, these conferences are by request only. Look for more information coming from your homeroom teachers regarding conferences.
- Friday, March 5 is now a NO SCHOOL day. The school and parish staff will be attending a Professional Development workshop that day.
- Finally, I want to celebrate an NWEA MAP Reading achievement for one of our third grade classes where nearly all students not only met their Winter 2021 growth goal, but reached high achievement status. Way to go, third graders!

Thank you for your continued patience, support and understanding as we navigate around all the obstacles being tossed our way to make in-person learning a reality during this memorable 2020-21 school year. You are all in my prayers. Have a blessed weekend.




Count Day Information
