- Welcome to Mr. Corey Garbutt, who joins our middle school teaching staff. He will be teaching middle school
 math and seventh grade geography. Mr. Garbutt has taught for nine years and joins our staff with knowledge and
 expertise in differentiated instruction as well as the NWEA. He is a parishioner and school parent and is looking
 forward to getting into the classroom. His first day is Monday.
- A big thank you goes out to all who participated in the Lincoln Driven to Give promotional event that was held
 last month. The school will be receiving a check for nearly \$4700. We are already looking forward to and
 planning next year's promotion.
- Our NWEA testing window opens up next week. Our students will be taking their first round of NWEA tests throughout the mornings over the next two weeks of school.

The GCCS principals and pastors have been meeting with Mrs. Kasey Cronin, the Director of GCCS and Mr. Tom Maloney, Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Lansing periodically to discuss the sustainability of Catholic education in our region. Here is a brief message from Kasey.

Work continues to be done to bring long-term sustainability to Catholic education in Genesee County. The Diocese of Lansing, under the direction of Superintendent of Schools Mr. Tom Maloney, has contracted with an outside consulting firm. The firm has worked closely with Mr. Maloney along with the Pastors and Principals of the GCCS to evaluate our schools, operations, long-term outlook, local data, other Catholic school models around the state and country, as well as identifying potential areas of opportunity. The entire group has met twice and is regularly engaged in this work. We acknowledge and understand your interest in staying informed on this matter. Our mission to serve your family and children is the reason behind this work and we will continue to update you throughout the process. Please pray for this work.

Daily Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures



Please remember that K-8 Drop Off starts daily at 7:40 AM. Any students dropped off prior to 7:40 AM will be sent to Jets Club and charged a fee. There is no supervision for students prior to

7:40 AM, so students will be sent to Jets Club for safety reasons.

After school, ALL students are sent to the loop or Jets Club. There is no lobby pickup with the exception of Preschool 3. Any students in the lobby after 3:30 PM will be sent to the loop and then to Jets Club if they have not been picked up. Jet Club fees will apply. Students are not permitted to wait in the lobby due to weather. If there is a weather emergency, all students will be held in the building until the emergency is over. Otherwise, all students will be sent to the loop.


Volunteer Opportunities
