#### Daily Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

Please remember that K-8 Drop Off starts daily at 7:40 AM. Any students dropped off prior to 7:40 AM will be sent to Jets Club and

charged a fee. There is no supervision for students prior to 7:40 AM, so students will be sent to Jets Club for safety reasons.

After school, ALL students are sent to the loop or Jets Club. There is no lobby pickup with the exception of Preschool 3. Any students in the lobby after 3:30 PM will be sent to the loop and then to Jets Club if they have not been picked up. Jet Club fees will apply. Students are not permitted to wait in the lobby due to weather. If there is a weather emergency, all students will be held in the building until the emergency is over. Otherwise, all students will be sent to the loop.

#### **APPLEFEST LOOP**

- Applefest Loop begins with AM loop September 9th and will continue until all tents have been taken down. This loop will be used in the AM and PM for ALL families (Preschool-8th grade). For Applefest Loop, please drive down the hill to the K of C lot and drive back up the hill. When the car line extends past the K of C lot, please turn right into the dirt lot by Bush Park to create multiple lines. We cannot back up traffic at the top of the hill per the Fenton Police. Your child will exit the car at the top of the hill by the playground on the passenger side.
- Look for adult supervisors or staff members for direction. There will be middle students helping escort younger students into the building in the morning.
- Please be patient and plan extra time. We will have preschoolers that need to be buckled into car seats so your patience is greatly appreciated. All families should use the Applefest Loop for drop-off and pick-up.
- Please do not park and have your child cross the street. It is too busy and dangerous.

#### DISMISSAL INFORMATION

- Applefest opens with a prayer on Thursday at 3 PM. Our students will attend the opening prayer ceremony with their class. For safety reasons, no students will be dismissed from this ceremony. All students will return to their class for regular dismissal at 3:30 PM.
- Please return your pink Applefest Thursday dismissal form ASAP. Any student who does not return their Applefest Dismissal Form will be sent to the Applefest Loop on Thursday.
- We will dismiss on Friday at 11:30 AM. **Applefest will not be open at that time**. All students will be sent to Applefest Loop on Friday. Please do not give your student permission to attend Applefest at that time.


